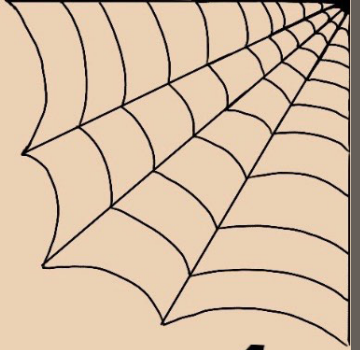
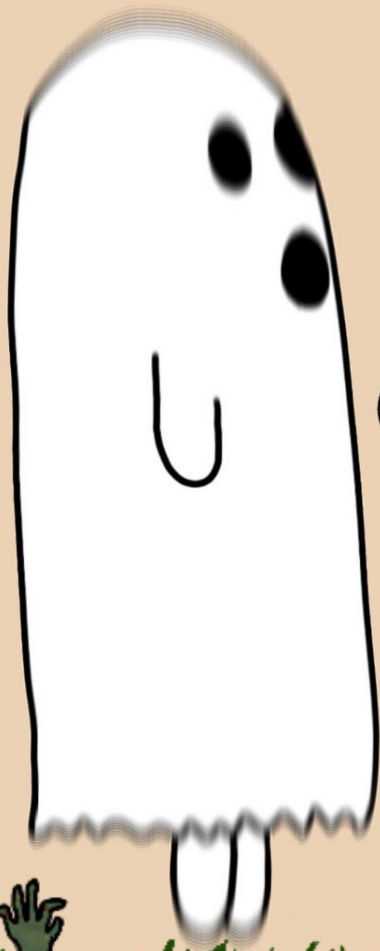
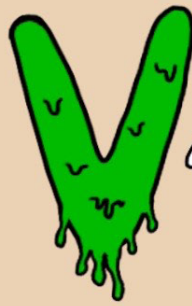

# GOOSE: LIVE AT THE JOY THEATER

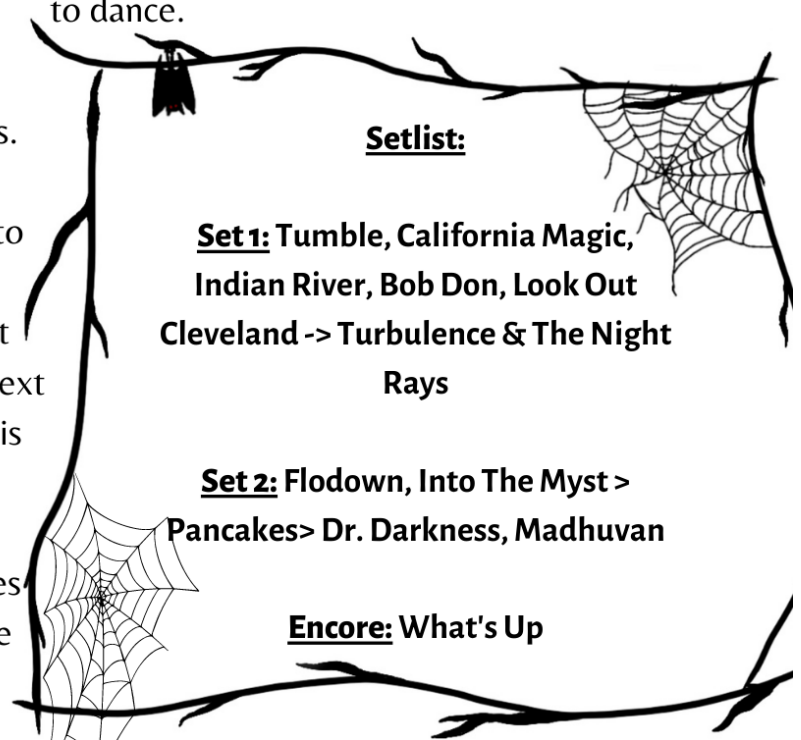
Goose embarked on a two-night run at the Joy Theater as part of their Dripfield fall tour spanning across the south, culminating with stops at the Austin City Music Limits Festival. Based out of Connecticut, Goose has emerged onto the live music scene - from playing small theaters and bars in 2019 to headlining sold-out shows at Radio City Music Hall and Red Rocks this past summer. The band blends a fresh sound of indie-rock with heavy jamming that appeals to music fans across genres.

Following the birth of my third child, my wife was kind enough to let me attend night two of the sold-out shows at the Joy. The first set catered more to the indie rock style, but still had some quality jams with the opener, Tumble, and set closer Look Out Cleveland (The Band cover) transitioning into Turbulence and the Night Rays.

As a jam band fanatic, I was eager for the band to take flight and display the kind of musicianship that I know they're capable of. They did just that with the 2nd set opener, Flodown. The person next to me, recognizing the upcoming song, said to his girlfriend, "just imagine you're at a high-energy hoedown." The band kept that high energy flowing with a light-hearted song called Pancakes that put a smile on my face while trying to dance in the thick crowd.

Lead vocalist and guitarist Rick Mitarotonda is without a doubt the driving force behind the band's unique sound. His guitar solos travel on extended horizontal planes, eventually culminating in high-energy peaks. This was most evident with the 2nd set closer, Madhuvan, which ended up lasting approximately 20 minutes. Reading some comments on Reddit the next day, many hardcore fans labeled it their favorite version they've heard. They ended the night with a bust-out cover of 4 Non Blondes classic What's Up that got the crowd singing in unison.

After selling out two nights at the Republic last year, followed by two sold-out nights at the Joy, let's hope that their next stop within New Orleans is at the Saenger - there'll be more room to dance.

### scorpio

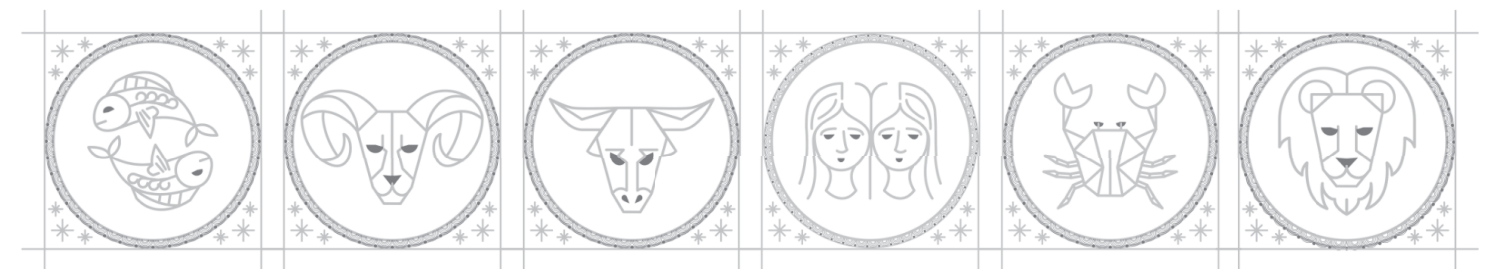
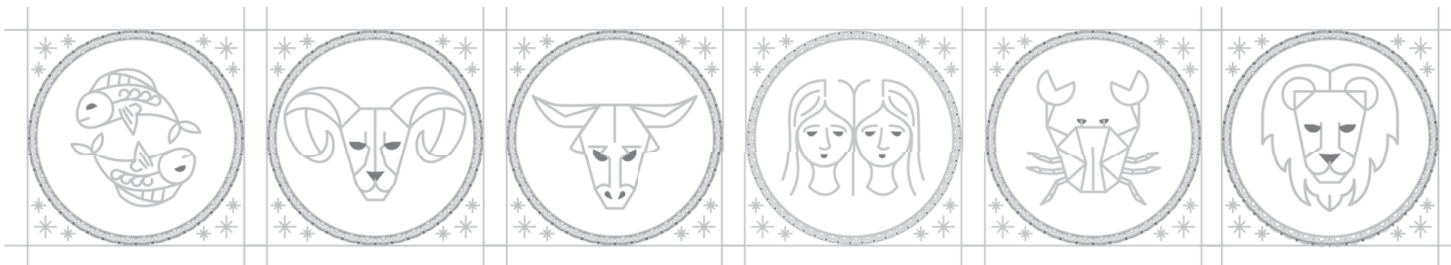
do some party hopping to fit your fun and social self, and i know that half the fun for you will be figuring out a costume that will please all the groups you visit!
